- **Folder 1:** Notice to the Belgian people asking them to stay calm and collaborate with the German military if they don't want to suffer the horrors of war
- **Folder 2:** August 22, 1914, Order to the people of Liège asking them to stay calm if they don't want to expect reprisals
- Folder 3: August 29, 1914, Requisition order sent to the commune of Lunéville
- **Folder 4:** September 3, 1914, Notice to the population of Lunéville that an indemnity of 650 000 francs is imposed on the commune because of a recent attack against German military
- **Folder 5:** Proclamation to the population of Lunéville announcing that leaving houses is strictly forbidden so far as this is not absolutely necessary
- **Folder 6:** Proclamation of the mayor of Lunéville requesting the inhabitants to abstain from trying to communicate with the French military
- **Folder 7:** August 28, 1914, Notice to the people of Saint-Dié announcing the rules established by the German military
- **Folder 8:** September 12, 1914, Notice to the people of Reims announcing that several people has been taken hostages and that they will be shot in case of disorder

Folder 9: September 22, 1914, Notice to the people of Lille announcing that four men has been condemned and shot

Folder 10: October 12, 1915, Proclamation announcing that several people has been condemned by the military court in Bruxelles because of treason
