## **Biographical / Historical Note**

James Parkerson Kemper was born in St. Mary Parish on August 5, 1868. He was the originator and pioneer in the field of flood control in Louisiana. He first advocated his plan of flood control around 1912, and for a number of years was practically the only engineer to persist in the advocacy of is ideas. Kemper's plan included the construction of a spilldam or spillway to relieve the flooding Mississippi through a direct channel to the Atchafalaya Basin and then to the open Gulf. Over time, he turned his attention to writing personal memoirs and histories of Bayou Teche. [Source: LSM accession notes]
